INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

Pharmagene is an open access journal, published half-yearly to promote rapid publication (original research articles, review articles, and short communication) in all fields of Pharmaceutical sciences. All manuscripts are subjected to peer review and high quality articles (which are not previously published and are not in consideration for publication with other journals) are published. On submission, the manuscript number will be mailed to the corresponding author.

The authors are required to take moral responsibility that the submitted manuscript is original and not under consideration in any other journal. Corresponding author should ensure that all co authors are aware of the submission and approve the contents of the submitted manuscript.

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The manuscript should be prepared in English using MS Word in Times New Roman font using a font size of 12, except the Title of the article, which shall be in a font size 14. Title and Section-Headings should be in bold and 'All Caps' format. Subtitles in each section shall be in sentence case and bold.

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Abstract

Abstract should be not more than 300 words. Abbreviations, diagrams and references should not be part of Abstract.

Keywords

Author(s) should give approximately 2-5 most important terms covered in the manuscript as key words.

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The manuscript should include a brief introduction stating the rationale of the research, with a brief overview of prior arts. The objective of the research should be clear in the introduction.

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Detailed information must be provided about the materials, instruments, chemicals, media and experimental procedures so that other research fellows can reproduce the work. All the ethical approvals associated in the research work must be specified.

If the manuscript contains *in vivo* experiments involving animals or humans, 'Method' section of the manuscript should state whether due permission for conduction of these experiments was obtained from respective authorized Ethics Committee, like the Institutional Animal Ethical Committee for experiments conducted on animals and the Ethics Committee or the Institutional Review Board for human studies.

Results and Discussions

The results should be concisely presented. Tables and figures should explain the experimental data obtained. The tables and figures should be appropriately placed in the manuscript. The interpreted results should be explained clearly in discussions.

Conclusion

This part should include brief outcomes of the study relating with the aim. It should be short and informative.

Acknowledgement (optional)

Acknowledgement (if any) should be written before reference section and should not be more than 100 words.

References

References to the literature cited in the manuscript should be numbered in order of appearance in the manuscript and cited in the text with superscript Arabic numbers. The titles of journals should be abbreviated according to the style used in Index Medicus. Use complete name of the journal for non-indexed journals. Information from manuscripts submitted but not accepted should be cited in the text as “unpublished”. The references should follow the following format:

Standard Journal Article

Author(s) of article (Surname Initials). Title of Article. Abbreviated Journal title, Year of publication; volume number (issue number): page numbers.

Books and other Monographs

Author(s) of book (Surname Initials). Title of book. Edition. Place of publication: Publisher; Year of publication, page numbers.

Example

Rang HP, Dale MM, Ritter JM, Moore PK. *Pharmacology*. 5th ed. Edinburgh: Churchill Livingstone; 2003, pp79-86.

Chapter in a Book

Author(s) (Surname Initials). Chapter Title. In: Editor(s) (surname initials), Editors. Title of book. Edition. Place of publication: Publisher; Year of publication, page numbers.

Example

Fiese EF, Hagen TA. Preformulation. In: Lachman L, Lieberman HA, Kanig, JL, Editors. *The Theory and Practice of Industrial Pharmacy*. 3rd ed. Varghese Publishing House, Bombay; 1991. p. 171-94.

Patent

Name of inventor(s) (Surname Initials). Name of assignee. Title of Patent. Patent number, Date of filing (Mon, DD, YYYY).

Example

Rao RA. Ancel Pharma R&D Inc. Novel hydroquinolones as aromatase inhibitors. United States patent 2002011349, Nov. 04, 2010

World Wide Web

Author (If any). Title, Date. Complete web address. Accessed on date (DD/MM/YYYY).

Example

Patel V. Process validation: An essential process in pharmaceutical industry, January 2010. <http://www.pharmainfo.net/reviews/process-validation-essential-processpharmaceutical-industry> accessed on 18/8/2012.

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Each table should have a short, descriptive title and numbered in the order cited in the text. Tables should not duplicate data given in the text or figures. Only MS word table format should be used for preparing tables. Tables should show lines separating columns with those separating rows.

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
